The Ministry of Foreign Affairs, based on a request submitted by the Open Society Fund, Inc., USA, for registration in the Registration of Foreign Persons with Subsidiaries in the Republic of Macedonia, according to article 4 of the Bill on defining requirements for the opening and functioning of foreign subsidiaries (Official Bulletin of SFRJ no. 75/89) and article 209 paragraph 1 of the Law on General Administrative Procedure (Official Bulletin of SFRJ No. 47/86) issued a

DECISION

- I. It registers in the Register of Foreign Persons with Subsidiaries in the Republic of Macedonia, under serial no. 63, the opening of Open Society Fund, Inc. 888 Seventh Avenue, New York, USA, a subsidiary with the following data:
 - 1. A subsidiary of the Open Society Fund, Inc. Skopje, bul. Ilindenska bb, Republic of Macedonia.
 - 2. The activities of the subsidiary are:

to represent the Open Society Fund, Inc. and its activities in the Republic of Macedonia, to explore ways and methods for closer collaboration between the Foundation and Macedonian institutions, to organize propaganda activities, symposiums, seminars and participate in them, to provide scholarships and to help talented pupils and students, to make contacts with outstanding poets and artists, etc.

- 3. The Open Society Fund, Inc. New York, USA, appoints, empowers and authorizes Mr. Vladimir Milcin as its true and lawful agent and attorney-in-fact.
 - II. The subsidiary of the Open Society Fund, Inc. USA, is authorized to begin its activities from the date the decision is signed.

JUSTIFICATION

The Open Society Fund, Inc., USA, has submitted a request to the Ministry of Foreign Affairs for approval of the opening of a subsidiary with the disposition mentioned above.

The OSF, Inc., USA encloses the documents required by article 4 paragraph 5 of the above mentioned Bill.

The procedure executed by the Ministry of Foreign Affairs for opening a subsidiary is proved to be in accordance with the law.

The decision for registration in the Register of Foreign Persons with Subsidiaries in the Republic of Macedonia, will be announced in the "Official Bulletin of the Republic of Macedonia" and the costs for it will be borne by the foreign person.

The decision is made according to the disposition mentioned above.

Any complaint may be submitted to the Government of the Republic of Macedonia 15 days after the announcement.

A fee for the decision amounting to 100 denars has been paid in accordance with the Administrative Taxes Act (Macedonian Official register no. 7/92).

A YEAR AFTER

The Open Society Fund of Macedonia was founded and registered on October 1, 1992 under the name of OSF - Skopje. Following one-day visit to Macedonia on October 19, 1992, George Soros decided to rename the foundation to OSF of Macedonia. This decision was an essential step towards the successful promotion of the OSF with the people of this newly formed country. Moreover, the renaming was followed by the announcement of an initial budget of one million dollars for much-needed medical supplies. These supplies were distributed to 45 medical institutes in cities and villages throughout the country. This critical infusion of supplies came at a time when Macedonia faced a blockade of nearly all imports run by some of its neighboring countries, in particular Greece from the south. During the difficult winter months of 1993, while the multiethnic government coalition fought for international recognition, George Soros' aid and the OSF of Macedonia's programs were the only sources of hope for the citizens of Macedonia. They were also the only evidence that the newly established independent state and its inhabitants had not been forgotten by the international community and left to die slowly, somewhere at the edge of the civilization and not far from the battlefields in Bosnia.

During the first year of its existence, the OSF of Macedonia was under constant pressure for time. As a newly established foundation we wanted to quickly initiate and support as many regional programs as possible. At the same time, we hope to establish the basis for a set of national programs. These national plans would be necessary to help this largely undeveloped and isolated country find its way as an independent state. To these ends, we promoted the transformation and resurgence of scientific, educational and cultural institutions. The OSF helped non-governmental organizations get on their feet, professional associations to reestablish broken ties with the world, and young scholars to present their achievements abroad. Basic aid was also provided for the system of medical care and for refugees. With these measures, we hoped to promote the ideals of a pluralistic and open society.

Our plans were brave and ambitious. To affirm the concept of Macedonia as a democratic state for all its citizens, regardless their confessional and ethnic origins, to stimulate initiatives for cooperation in the Balkans and to help the process of connecting Macedonia with Europe and world-were mainstreams of OSF of Macedonia's strategy from its conception. Macedonia can survive as a civil state only with an open society in which ethnic, confessional and linguistic differences are regarded as valuable assets, not as obstacle or the source of problems and conflicts. And yet, at every turn, we found ourselves, and the new state, challenged. The state, and the new country's major ethnic group, the Macedonians, were denied the right to their name, their identity, their past and an independent future. The OSF of Macedonia worked hard to help this new country overcome these many obstacles.

I am convinced that this report gives sufficient evidence for the successful implementation of our intended strategy and its mapping into projects and grants.

The Macedonian public has continuously reviewed our decisions, and expressed their support and gratitude. To be sure, there were also negative reactions to our work. These, however, usually came from individuals and groups who had committed themselves to some other vision of Macedonia, usually one in which the forces of war and nationalistic intolerance would dominate.

This report recounts our history, but it also heralds a new year for OSF and for Macedonia. It seems we passed through our childhood very quickly. In little more than one year, the Foundation has matured, just like the new country, yet we continue to confront new challenges. 1994 is the election year for Macedonia. For only the second time in its history, the nation will hold parliamentary and presidential elections. The elections emphasize the significance of independent media to the democratic atmosphere and political culture in Macedonia. Extremists will no doubt attempt to use nationalism and ethnic rivalry to divide the population into ethnic and confessional camps, threatening the survival of a free and open society in Macedonia.

Beyond its politics, Macedonia is also confronted with difficult economic and social challenges. The economic situation in Macedonia is not expected to improve to the coming year. Macedonia will continue to suffer from the sanctions imposed against Yugoslavia by the international community, and Macedonian government must continue a firm and restrictive economic policy in order to ensure access to international monetary institutions. Meanwhile, the privatization process has begun. Support for privatization efforts, including management training, has become a top priority for the OSF.

The most obvious social challenges include the presence of refugees, an increasing problem of drug abuse among youths, and a lack of adequate medical equipment for hospitals and clinics. But the OSF is reaching out in new and innovative ways. Recently, for example, the OSF established Center for Mental Crisis for Children and Youth / Mental Advisory. This project will promote communication and understanding among an often overlooked part of our population, and bring to light the difficulties of drug abuse, isolation and hopelessness among the young.

OSF of Macedonia and its programs remains the most prominent and, in some cases, the only hope for many of the people of Macedonia. The OSF will continue to be a vital recourse for the institutions and associations who strive to bring humanity and democracy to the life of this small country.

EDUCATION

In its first year of activities, OSF of Macedonia faced the difficult task of helping to rebuild the nation's educational institutions. Curricula needed to be renewed. Libraries had not received any new books or journals in almost ten years. There was a woeful lack of new textbooks. Laboratories wanted for even the most basic technical equipment.

Beyond these basic necessities, education in Macedonia was, and remains, appallingly isolated. In 1993, there were only three visiting teachers at Macedonia's two universities. Due to a lack of information on where and how to apply for scholarships, there were few opportunities for Macedonian graduate and post-graduate students to study in the west.

In response to these challenges, OSF has supported a number of important projects.

Jentral European University

The local HESP took several factors into consideration in its decision to support a variety of programs for higher education in Macedonia.

- 1. The difficulties involved in providing universities with curricula, books and periodicals. Our response was to fund the purchase new books and periodicals and to support subscriptions in new and previously received titles.
- 2. The lack of material and equipment. By the end of the year the OSF Macedonia provided fax machines, PCs, printers, copy machines and other office equipment to the following institutions: Institute of Philosophy, Institute of Sociology, Institute of Psychology, Department for General and Comparative Literature, Faculty of Law, Faculty of Economy, Faculty of Pharmacology and Faculty of Agriculture.
- 3. A need for support in covering travel / accommodation expenses and registration fees for professors and students. The OSF established and supported the exchange of professors and students at seminars and conferences in order to allow them to exchange information and knowledge outside Macedonia.
- 4. The lack of funding for special projects in particular, support in covering materials and equipment for projects, travel expenses and specialized literature. By the end of August, we had received several requests for Higher Education Institutional Projects support. The Board's decision was to have two reviewers on each project as the basis of decision making. After the Board meeting held in November 29, 1993 the projects listed below were chosen to be granted with equipment:

Kliment Ohridski", Bitola have been awarded Medical CD ROMs through the Soros Foundation Medical Program. Representatives from those libraries participated at the Library training course held in Budapest in December 1993.

There is a large Roma minority in Macedonia. At the beginning of the school year, OSF of Macedonia purchased 2.500 sets of textbooks to Roma children from families in poor social conditions.

The program costs of OSF - Macedonia are costs for advertisting, administering and costs for mailing.

HUMANITARIAN

The first shipment of medical supplies donated by the OSF has been distributed proportionally to 45 Medical Care Institutions throughout Macedonia. The institutions were divided into 5 groups, and classified according to their patients load and the spectrum of medical services provided.

Group I. Four Large hospitals and University Clinics in Skopje

Group II. Nine Large Regional Medical Centers

Group III. Eight Medium Sized Regional Health Centers

Group IV. Fourteen Small Regional Health Centers

Group V. Ten Specialized Hospitals

The OSF also provided sera for testing donors' blood in the Macedonian transfusion centers, and reagents for diagnostics for laboratory tests in the histopathological laboratories. We also provided for the purchase of medical supplies for obstetrics facilities, and covered the expenses for delivering diagnostics and sera to Macedonia. Other programs included the costs of transportation of 5 ambulance cars which were donated by the German Red Cross, and the establishment of a Crisis Center for psychological counseling and help for adolescents and children.

Our support of the Children's Consulate General of the Republic of Macedonia included office supplies, educational material, financial support. The OSF also entered into a joint program with the Children's Consulate in Macedonia to distribute textbooks for children in refugee centers and to support children from economically jeopardized Macedonian families. We also helped with purchase of two minibuses and one coach bus for transportation of school children from three Refugee centers to the schools, and providing clothing for the currently residing in the 5 Refugees Centers in Macedonia. In addition, the OSF provided New Years presents for the refugee children, and helped with the distribution of food and medical supplies.

As a part of the Medical Equipment for Macedonia 1993 Project, OSF-Macedonia helped 5 hospitals acquire modern medical equipment for crucial medical services in the areas of health care for children, protection of pregnancy, diabetes diagnosis and treatment and diagnosis of malignancy. The medical instruments were purchased, with assistance from The Albert Schweitzer Institute for the Humanities and Nubenco Enterprises, Inc. The hospitals involved were:

Also at this meeting, the Board approved financial support for the Institute of Economy for organizing a 4 day seminar on Basic Management. Our plan is to use this seminar to pool managers about their needs, and in this way gather information to help design our Management program for next year.

MEDIA

One year ago, when Open Society Fund of Macedonia was founded, there were 25 small private radio and 15 TV station in all of Macedonia. All of these station suffered with poor technical equipment and very modest list of programs. However, the lack of legislation regulating and monitoring the broadcast media has led to an explosion in their number.

Our idea was to give a little help to as possible, and then see who managed to survive. After acquiring a clear picture about the small radio and TV stations, we decided to help 6 TV and 10 radio stations by providing them with equipment for news editing. This support yielded important results. At least 6 TV stations (TV A-1 Skopje, TV Tera Bitola, TV Skaj Kavadarci, TV Art Tetovo, TV Zdravkin Titov Veles and TV VIS Strumica) and 9 radio stations (Radio Skaj, Radio Libertas, Radio Uno, Radio Kanal 4, Studentsko radio, Radio Toska, all from Skopje and Radio Delises Resen, Radio Kanal 77 Stip and Super Radio from Ohrid) followed our lead. The equipment improved the quality of programs, and the video copying equipment at Soros Press & Information Center give at least 15 local TV stations the opportunity to obtain and broadcast movies and other foreign programs subtitled in Macedonian. These improvements greatly increased the competitiveness of the "small" stations.

When it seemed that all newspaper in Macedonia would be forced to stop printing due to lack of foreign currency for newsprint, we intervened by buying paper for almost every newspaper published in the country. The list includes "Nova Macedonia", "Flaka e vllazerimit", "Birlik", "Puls", children's magazines, "Zbor", "Trudbenik", "Mlad borec" and "Delo". The paper provided for newspapers enabled them to survive for the time being.

In the short period of our existence, we have also attempted to give assistance by facilitating the exchange of journalists with OSF Albania, sending journalists to various meetings, assisting their participation in regional programs and organizing seminars. From September 25th to 26th, Soros Media Coordinators Meeting was held in Ohrid. Immediately after the meeting, from 27th to 29th of September, the Balkan Independent Media Meeting took place, also in Ohrid.

PUBLISHING

Keeping in mind the difficult situation with books and periodical in Macedonia, we found it important to arrange our publishing activities in the following way:

OSF Macedonia supported recently established small publishers by covering printing expenses. The OSF Macedonia also supported publications that were edited in the languages of ethnic minorities living in Macedonia, as well as books in Macedonian that reveal and represent the cultures and traditions of those minorities. A third criterion we followed in program evaluation involved support for the publishing programs of local publishers, in particular those working on translations of important philosophical and sociological books that have not been translated into Macedonian before. Several journals, including cultural journals, journals of social theory and criticism, and journals in the languages of ethnic minorities were given permanent financial support, with grants to cover around 20% of their total costs. This kind of help was meant to enable them to appear continuously. Since the Board found them to be of high theoretical and aesthetic value, they have been granted this kind of support.

CONFERENCE AND TRAVEL

The program for Individual Grants was designed to provide financial support for individuals and for their participation in seminars, conferences, congresses and for study stay abroad up to three months.

The conditions to gain such financial support were these: the candidate must not be older then 45 years of age. They must be college graduate and they must have an official invitation from the organizer of the event. In addition, we require two recommendations and the assurance of involvement of another institution in partly covering his or her costs.

During 1993, 173 applicants asked for help. The Board chose to support 107 of them, which in effect depleted the entire budget for this year. 4 of the applicants turned down our offers for various reasons; 56 participated in congresses, seminars and conferences; 47 applicants use the funds to study abroad; 45 candidates asked us to cover their board expenses; 58 to cover travel expenses; 87 candidates went to West Europe, USA and Australia; 16 candidates went to Eastern Europe.

From the number of requests we received, it is clear that this program caused great deal of excitement in Macedonia. We expect the number of requests to be even grater next year.

INSTITUTIONAL GRANTS / EQUIPMENT SUPPORT

During this year an Open competition for institutional projects was announced. However, the requests we received were all initiated by the Faculties. Nonetheless, we did offer funding for technical support for several interesting projects.

For example of 19 institutions which received support, the largest amount was granted to the Association of Organizations for Technical Culture for the Workshop for Gifted Children. This grant allowed the Association to purchase 2 servers, 20 computer terminals and 2 printers with modem cards In addition, we were able to provide funding for an editing unit for the Film Library of Macedonia, as well as a telefax machine, a PC and an Laser Printer for the National Museum of Ohrid. We also funded the purchase of 3 PCs and 3 printers for the Macedonian Academy of Science and Art in order to help them to realize 7 of their own projects.
