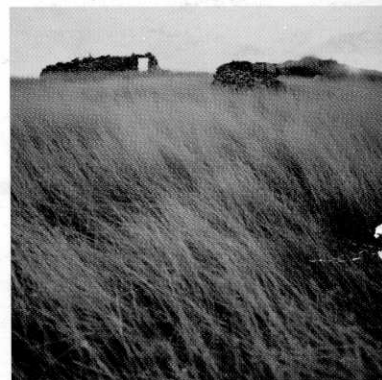

NARROW ROAD, THIRD STEP



It seemed that with the signing of the Macedonian - Greek Agreement, the Republic of Macedonia would finally come out of the dangerous war zone and enter the international community as an independent state. However, the attempted assassination of President Gligorov in October, 1995, showed the danger for a democratic Macedonia still exists. Terrorism came as a destructive response to the hopes resulting from the established diplomatic relations with the USA, admission of the Republic of Macedonia to the OSCE and Council of Europe, and the end of the Greek embargo.

During the first half of 1995, the Open Society Institute - Macedonia was subjected to a fierce campaign by the media that are close to the President and his cabinet. In this campaign, the Institute and George Soros were accused for putting pressure upon Macedonia to consent to Greek blackmail with the embargo, give up their identity and legalize the so-called Albanian University in Tetovo. Even the explicit and repeated statement by Mr. Soros' explaining that he does not support Tetovo University because he believes it could lead to the disintegration of Macedonia, did not help to silence the campaign. During this time, when the "regime" media nourished the Gligorov - Soros conflict and well known journalists attacked OSI - Macedonia, new voices appeared in the summer of 1995 - voiced of unknown or non-existent journalists, writing about a "deep crisis" within the Foundation. This campaign, the second one during 1995, took place when the Board made a decision to supplement initial enthusiasm with a stronger organization and professionalism, strictly determined procedures for decision making and personal and professional responsibility.

In 1995, a significant change in our program priorities was made. Instead of the humanitarian program and the media program, the highest priority was given to the education programs. The pre-school program "Step-by-Step" grew from 18 groups in 1994 to 218 groups in 1995, encompassing 40% of all the chil-

dren in kindergarten. OSI - Macedonia is a valued and visible player on the education scene in Macedonia. Its relations with the national education authorities are positive and invite a deeper involvement in the restructuring of the educational system. The Active Learning Project initiated new teaching methodologies in 11 primary schools. More than 40 secondary schools have received computer classrooms. Our partners in the field of education include UNICEF, the British Council, USIS - Skopje, CEPES - UNESCO.

One of the most important achievements with a positive impact on higher education, was the involvement of Macedonia in INTERNET, a project undertaken with the Austrian Government as co-financer.

The media program helped establish direct links among ten private radio stations. This scheme has given serious competition to the state radio. The network connection of five private TV stations was stopped, since it represented a large financial risk before the enactment of the new laws on telecommunication and on radio and TV broadcasting. OSI - Macedonia was very active in the public debate on these laws in order for the laws to encourage not hinder private electronic media. Media monitoring was initiated with the European Media Institute - Dusseldorf and publication of the Macedonia Media Bulletin began. The small rotation press in "Europe 92" and the support in the form of paper, made it possible for several alternative newspapers to exist, including "DELO" in the Macedonian language, and "KOHA" in the Albanian language. Soon "DNEVNIK" (*The Daily*), will be published, supported by a grant and a no-interest loan from OSI - Macedonia.

Our first experience with giving loans is the credit line for small farmers who previously had received technical support from VOCA. The credits, with a maximum value of \$5,000.00, are being repaid on time, giving a reason for optimism about credit projects.



The English language school, Soros International House - Skopje, made a profit of \$170,000.00, and came closer to the status of self-financing. This school will play an important role in the training and teaching in English language, a need of essential importance for improving teaching in English language.

The Publishing and Arts and Culture programs played an important role also in 1995, supporting the multi-cultural wealth of Macedonia. Translations from the classic languages into Macedonian represents a significant contribution towards surpassing the marginalised status of the Macedonian language. Under this program, the tragedies of the ancient Greek authors Sophocles and Euripides were published, which is also of importance in breaking the artificial barriers between Greece and Macedonia.

The Community of Painting Artists received a strong support from SCCA - Skopje, making it possible for this community to express their creative potentials at individual and group exhibitions in Macedonia and abroad. Because of SCCA painting artists from Macedonia can participate not lag behind what is happening in Europe.

Provincialism and narcissistic views of local traditional values are the source of intolerance towards

the idea of an open society. The East - East program seeks to irradiate these negative trends by comparing Macedonian culture to other cultures. The annual meeting of students of drama art school, "SKOMRAHI", is one of the prominent cultural events in Skopje. The other dimension of this program is best expressed through the program "Advanced Conflict Resolution, Training for Trainers from Albania, Macedonia and Yugoslavia".

Non-government organizations interested in human rights, ethnic conflicts, women's rights, protection of the human environment, were supported in their activities. In 1995, these groups encouraged to develop their own programs and their involvement in international initiatives.

OSI - Macedonia concluded a wide range of programs in 1995, and as a result, its role has been significant in supporting democratic, civil and peaceful option in Macedonia.

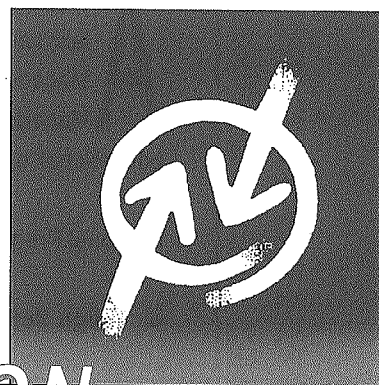

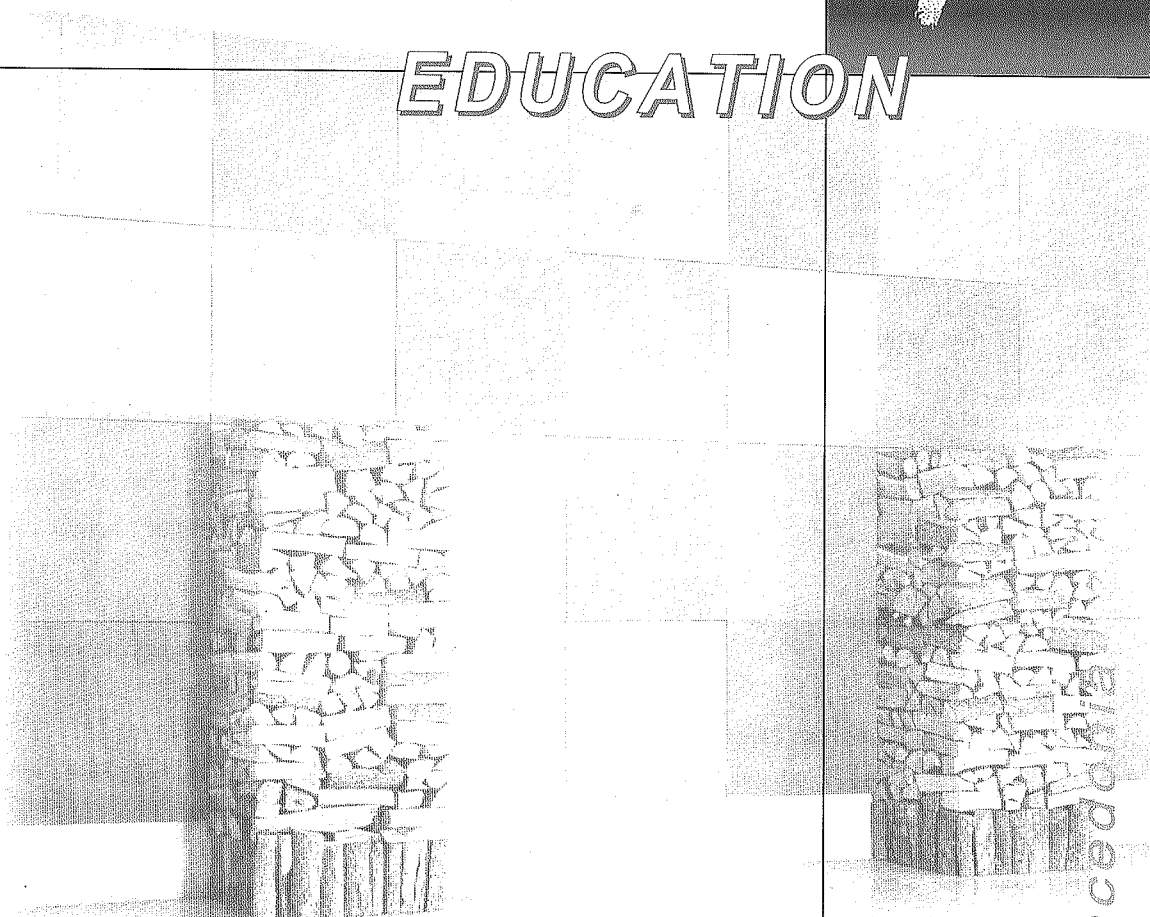

Active Learning

Having in mind the possible negative consequences which children who are already included in the Step by Step program could face in their primary education, OSI Macedonia decided to support the Active Learning project, whose method of work is very similar to the Step by Step method.

Active Learning offers the possibility for learning through game, where the accent is placed on children's development and creativity, instead of memorizing facts and figures. Active Learning does not accept the traditional classroom, it gives the possibility for teaching and working all day long, without a school bell, while the whole content is accomplished. Even the arrangement of the furniture in the classroom is adapted to this kind of teaching, and there are no strictly established rules for the pupils. They can move from one activity corner to another.

Active Learning provokes a great interest among the students, teachers and parents. This is apparent from the many requests from the schools to expend the project.

The project is co-sponsored by OSI-Macedonia, UNICEF and the Ministry of Education. OSI-Macedonia granted the Active Learning Schools with equipment such as: TV and video recorders, copy machines, cassette players, etc. We also published workbooks and teacher manuals specially designed for this project. Packages with teaching materials were also distributed to 11 schools involved in the project.

Language Programs for Schools

Several seminars were organized this year to contribute to the improvement of the English language teaching in Macedonia. Two seminars were aimed at two profession profiles: businessmen and lawyers, to whom the knowledge of English is a prerequisite for educational improvement. The joint project with the United States Information Service - Skopje was also of high importance: 10 English language teachers had Teacher Trainers training in Skopje lasting 11 weeks and at the University of Alabama lasting 9 weeks. The following participated in the training: Vesna Stevkovska, Skopje; Liljana Boskova, Skopje; Biljana Poposka, Skopje; Aneta Stojanovska, Skopje; Divna Sipovic, Skopje; Suzana Miladinova, Skopje; Kristina Prenda, Gevgelija; Anica Petkoska, Gostivar; Simka Delevska, Tetovo; Zora Busovska, Ohrid. After finishing the training, they are going to train the teachers in their home cities. A course was organized for the secondary school "Orce Nikolov", Skopje which was the first school to introduce professional subjects taught in English language. Five professors - electrical engineers teaching a special electronics class which has subjects taught in English, attended the course. The course was held at the Soros International House - Skopje.

The program has reached a clear strategy centered around the Soros International House - Skopje. However, the educational improvement of the teachers in high schools is not of less important. Individual support was given only to those who through other financial sources, most often the British Council, provided their scholarships.

- **Events that marked the year 1995.**

1995 was a year of companies approaching SIH. During this year we were approached by a dozen companies that paid for English tuition for their employees.

Those students were of many different profiles so we provided the basic, General English tuition.

SIH Skopje also provides services for the local Soros foundation through numerous TOEFL, SAT and SLEP Exam preparations and their administration.

Furthermore 14 courses of General English were provided for the employees of the Foundation.

At the start of the 1995 - 1996 Academic year, International House's Teacher Selection failed to provide the requested number of teachers (requested 7, received 3). SIH couldn't cater for all the enrolled students and was forced in a position to return payments to the students. 134 students were rejected, in "green pieces of paper" amounting to \$10,720.

The International House Teacher Training Course took place in October and November. This was the first course of its kind in Macedonia. 11 teachers attended this course, teachers of English from the state run schools and teachers that teach in language schools. Two of them were employed by SIH.

- **Feedback**

As the aim of SIH - Skopje's is to become self-supportive in 1996 it has to rely on its students, for they are the ones that generate the income. In order to improve our services we distributed questionnaires in several semesters in 1995. This time we were interested mainly in expanding our services with new products, therefore some of the questions asked were:

Would you be interested in :

- Courses of other languages?
- Business English courses?
- ESP Courses?

However the usual questions on quality and student satisfaction with classes, staff and content of courses were still included in these feedback forms.

The options and feedback from the students were looked into very carefully.

• Students

This year, the second of operation, we increased the number of students to 1900 an average of 380 students per semester. Still SIH Skopje is the second largest language school in Macedonia, and definitely the largest when it comes to English.

Financial Report

In our second year of operation we lowered the budget to a minimum and relied upon our income. Because of the unfortunate situation at the start of the academic year we had to ask for an allocation of \$15,128 from other programs of OSI-Macedonia.

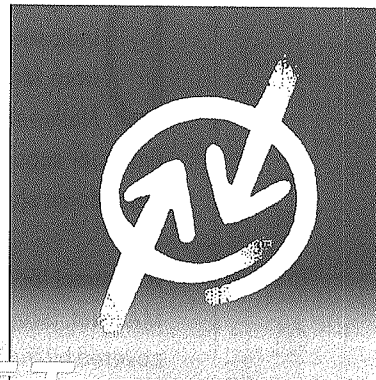

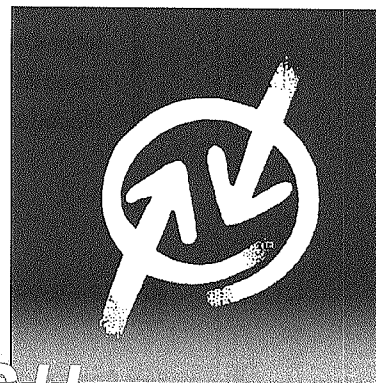
During 1995, several activities took place in the realization of the Internet/E-Mail Program. The experience and indications from previous year showed that the realization of the idea for establishing a permanent Internet link from Macedonia to the world is inevitable. Together with the already present and administratively established National Network MARNet (Macedonian Academic and Research Network), an initiative was taken to provide financial support for this network, for the connection to Internet with a permanent link. With this, both universities in Macedonia should have been connected to Internet.

A contract for a 64 Kbps VSAT Link was made between the Rector's Office of the University "St. Kiril and Metodij" with MARNet, Skopje on one side, and PTT Austria as an Internet service provider, on the other. One half of the amount was covered by the Austrian government, and the second half is being covered by the Open Society Institute - Macedonia, as a grant to MARNet. Computer-communication equipment for providing Internet access was granted to MARNet, as a part of the University "St. Kiril and Metodij" in Skopje and to the Rector's Office of the University "St. Kliment Ohridski" in Bitola.

Until 15.06.1995, when MARNet was officially connected to Internet, OSI-Macedonia was using YUPAK as a major communication and data channel to the world (X.25 Packet Network). This was a very expensive and unreliable way of connection, which produced high telecommunication costs, but was one of the possible ways of linking to Internet. Some time after the establishment of MARNet's satellite link, OSI-Macedonia got full Internet access from this network.

Internet dial-up access for NGO's was established at the location of OSI-Macedonia, and the first Macedonian Web Server was created.

Head Start/Step by Step

The Step by Step program introduced a new curriculum, new approaches, and new recourses into the classrooms. Not only the physical transformation of the classrooms but also the energy and professionalism of the teachers trained under the project and the success in getting parents into classrooms as active partners in the educational process were indicators of what can be achieve in such a short period. Willingness for collaboration and change in the field of preschool education in Macedonia was demonstrated.

The principals and teachers from other kindergartens in Macedonia constantly visited the classrooms, because they were interested in accepting the program and opening Step by Step groups in their own kindergartens. It was also noticeable that the other kindergartens and other teachers, encouraged and inspired by the program, have already started to accept new ideas from the Soros Preschool Project. They have started with practical use of these ideas in their kindergartens, according to the staff, material and financial possibilities they have.

Having in mind this positive impact of the Step by Step program and the disturbing contrast between Step by Step classrooms and the traditional classrooms which run in parallel within the pilot schools, OSI decide to upgrade all preschool classes in the pilot schools so that children are not forced to endure "passive" classes whilst their peers are enjoying active learning in the next room.

The Step by Step program had several goals in 1995:

- improvement of the early childhood education;
- further development of the principles of active learning, with a maximum respect towards the child's personality;
- development of the concept for constant training of the teachers, education coordinators, teacher's assistants and the parents;
- development of ways for collaboration and involvement of the families into the educational process.

These goals were achieved in close collaboration with the Ministry of Labor and Social Policy and the Ministry of Education. The Ministry of Labor and Social Policy took an active role in the expansion of the project, providing financing for the summer training of the teachers and principals from the kindergartens, participating in the selection of the sites, the renovation of the learning space and ensuring staff and salaries for them.

Besides the ongoing contact with the Government officials, the Step by Step team had responsibilities to:

- establish a training team that will train staff from the kindergartens and will care about the quality of the program;
- plan teacher training workshops;
- investigate the possibilities of local production of equipment and high quality classrooms aids;
- order and deliver equipment, materials, toys, and art supplies to the sites.

200 Step by Step classrooms were established in 51 kindergartens in October on the territory of Macedonia.

OSI-Macedonia provided financing for: early education materials, parent involvement, classroom adaptation, transportation, seminars and teacher workshops.

In 1995, the Regional Program continued to support the 450 children from low-income families and provide financing for: parent involvement, renovation, transportation, and salaries for 50 teaching assistants.

STEP by STEP
Supported Kindergartens

1 1995 was the year that marked the public start of the program.

The visit of Carol Flaherty Zonnis to Macedonia at the beginning of 1995 was the final stage of preparations which started during the previous year, which included introduction of the concept to key officials and education related governmental organizations, and supplying their cooperation and help in promotion of the program.

The First Health Education Workshop took place in Ohrid, March 16 - 20. The training was conducted by Susan Shapiro and Carol Flaherty-Zonis. The workshop was organized in cooperation with the Pedagogical Institute of Macedonia (governmental educational organization, related to school program planning), and most of the participants from Macedonia's educational structures were chosen in cooperation with them.

Some of the participants were chosen because of their previous interest in the topics related to the program. They proved to be of great help to the program during the next few months, especially the participant from the Macedonian Anti AIDS Association: Dr. Goran Vesov, M.D. who worked as a trainer at the following workshop. There were also several participants members of the Macedonian Medical Student Association.

Four participants came from abroad: Damir Karpljuk and Eva Shushtaric from Ljubljana, Slovenia, and Katrzyna Kazberuk and Joana Kotlicka from Warshaw, Poland.

There were 40 registered participants and there were some participants who attended only specific lectures. Most of the participants are directly involved in the educational process as primary school teachers, pedagogues and school psychologists. There were also two sociologists and 3 medical doctors. Diversity was maintained in the field of ethnic structure of the participants, so that the members belonged to the Macedonian, Albanian, Serbian and Turk population.

The schedule included the following themes (in chronological order): Introduction to the Health Education philosophy, Nutrition, Alcohol and other drugs, Introduction to

Human Sexuality, AIDS, Smoking and Planing of future activities.

The access to "unconventional" (for Macedonian standards) teaching methods and current scientific information made the workshop exiting and successful.

The Peer Counseling Workshop took place in Ohrid, June 19-23.

The workshop was conducted by Dan Shapiro, Marius Mates and Craig Zelizer. There workshop had 27 participants: 4 psychologists (working at the Mental Crises Center for Children and Adolescents); 9 medical students (members of the Macedonian Medical Student Association); 5 teachers (mostly high school professors); 3 school psychologists and pedagogues; 1 sociologist and the support staff. The participants directly involved in the education process were invited with the cooperation of the Pedagogical Institute of Macedonia, and the representative Mr. Vlado Timovski. The ethnic background of the participants was various, and all major ethnic entities were represented.

The schedule consisted of Peer Counseling Training, which included teaching of communication skills, and an outline of Conflict Resolution. The training contents and used methods were a revelation for most of the participants.

The Second Health Education Workshop took place in Skopje, November 10 - 12th. The majority of the participants included selected teachers, school pedagogues and psychologists from the wider region of Skopje. Their workplaces include schools with Macedonian, Albanian, Turkish and other pupils, who study in their native languages. The subjects were the same as on the first workshop.

The training was conducted by the participants in the First Health Education workshop: D-r. Marriage Raleva (also a participant of the Peer Counseling Workshop), Eli Makazlieva (who participated in the Ballaton workshop) and D-r. Goran Vesov.

One of the main purposes of this workshop was selection of trainers who would be willing to work further on the program. Some of the participants were at the first workshop so that this was a follow-up seminar for them. Several candidates emerged, expressing large interest in the further development of the program.

Debate

The Debate Program which was designed to develop logical and critical thinking, rhetorical and communication skills, was established in 1994. Since the preparations for the program were done in 1994, the first introductory seminar for the teachers was held at the beginning of 1995. After that 7 Debate clubs were established in Skopje, Bitola, Gostivar and Kratovo.

The first national tournament was held at the end of year, with participation of all Debate clubs.

The need for establishing a Debate Center became very urgent, since many others teachers and schools showed interest in the training. Many students also expressed their willingness to participate in the program. Therefore, establishing the Center is our priority for the next year.

Regional Youth Program

The program supported youth projects that encourage their independent and critical thinking. The program also provides support to adult-initiated projects designed and implemented on behalf of the secondary school students.

Mostly the students showed interest in attending various international competitions, and seminars such as the seminars organized by the Research Station-Petnica, Yugoslavia.

Many associations also received support in organizing national competitions and festivals.

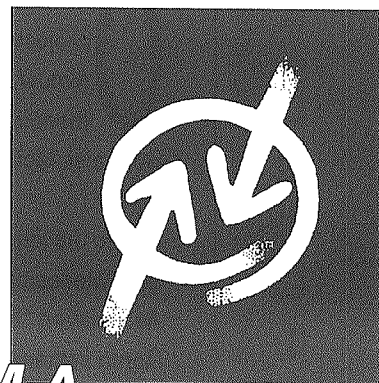
The publication of several youth magazines were supported through this program, also.

Roma

OSI-Macedonia in 1995 made efforts to follow the development of the Roma NGOs and to focus on supporting projects that are aimed at educational and cultural issues of the Roma population in Macedonia. Unfortunately, almost none of the Roma NGOs that we have contacts with have addressed these issues. There are only a few of them that have appeared on the NGO scene, and they were mainly occupied with humanitarian activities. They were also facing organizational problems.

Due to the limited funds, OSI-Macedonia has helped the Humanitarian and Charitable Associations "Daja" - Kumanovo and "Mesecina" - Gostivar to proceed further with their organizational development. The initiative of the Humanitarian Association "Esma" to provide textbooks, accessories and school bags for 200 school children from Shuto Orizari, a Roma settlement near Skopje, was supported as a joint project with the Catholic Relief Services - Skopje.

It was our expectation and effort that the Regional Roma Program should be much more involved in Macedonia. This did not go through.

The student organizations AEGEE, AISEC, ELFASCO and IAESTE were very active in establishing relations with European partners. Their activities change the inherited understanding in regard to student associations from the past, and this is the reason why they were supported through this program.

NGOs for protection of the human environment began to turn towards the other donors with whom they established contacts as a result of the grants awarded in 1993 and 1994 by the Open Society Institute - Macedonia.

The Balkan Center for Peace Studies became one of the first cells of open society in Macedonia, dedicated to non-violent conflict resolution, the culture of tolerance and understanding of ethnic and religious differences.

The Macedonian - Greek dispute was in the focus of international interest. This problem has its own impact on the political relations and options in Macedonia: nationalism or civil society. The Open Society Institute - Macedonia supported all the projects - in Greece, in Macedonia or in other third countries, where NGO activists or intellectuals from these two countries met.

The civil sector in Macedonia was enriched with NGOs and activists who engage in social assistance projects for supporting social marginal groups.

The NGO scene is still characterized with a good will and energy, rather than with knowledge that is necessary to provide stability of the NGOs, or more precisely - to develop a better coordination. One disturbing feature of the whole process is that the NGOs are concentrated exclusively in the capital city. Individual human rights are still outside the focus of interest, which is a consequence of the inter-ethnic tensions.

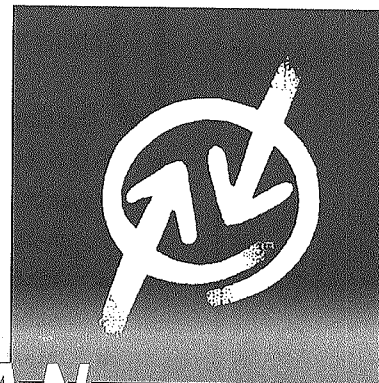

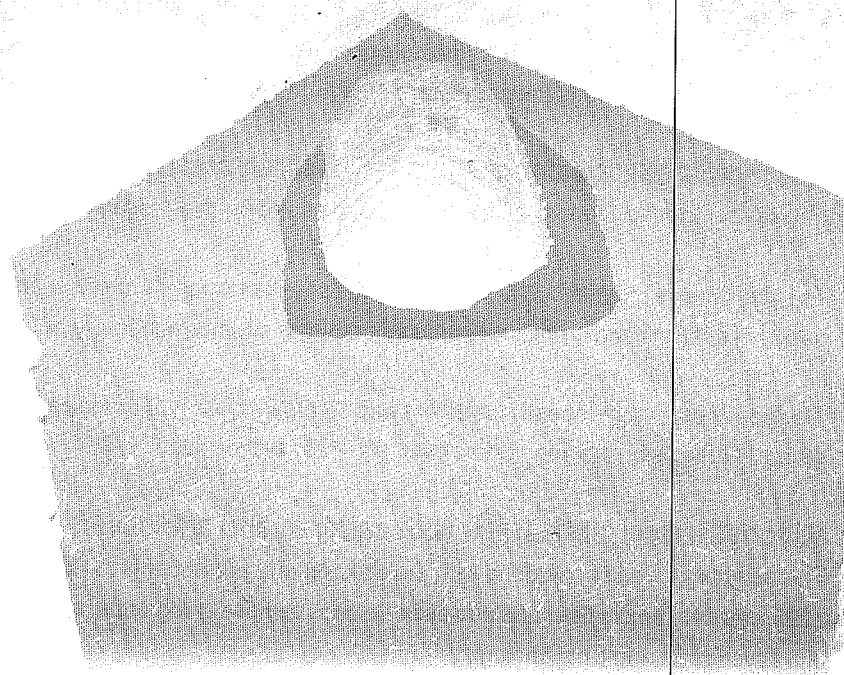

Mental Crisis Center for Children and Adolescents

During 1995 the Center continued with the activities that started in 1993, working towards the goal of achieving higher mental health standards of its clients and the society as a whole.

The Center was open for preventive, therapeutic and educational activities on three levels:

- S.O.S. telephone for children and adolescents
- Psychotherapeutic counselling for children and adolescents
- Psychotherapy workshops with children and adolescents
 - for children and adolescents in refugee camps Dare Bombol and Cicino Selo
 - schools
 - pre-school institutions

S.O.S. Telephone for Children and Adolescents

During 1995 the S.O.S. telephone accomplished 1081 therapeutic interventions. The majority of the phone calls were by children and adolescents between 8 and 25 years of age. Occasionally there was a certain number of parents asking for help about the actual problems of their children. The most common problems were: school problems 28,7%, development problems 21.1%, intimate problems 10.9%, family problems 7.5%, communication problems 6.2% ect.

Psychotherapeutic counselling for children and adolescents

Psychotherapeutic counselling for children and adolescents was lead by a psychiatrist and a neuro-psychiatrist.

The clients were created in 727 sessions, each session lasting 45 minutes. The problems that were treated were mostly personal conflicts and crisis, interpersonal problems, problems in family, school and surroundings ect.

The type of psychotherapeutic treatment was determined , as well as indication of future psychotherapy work (individual, group, family) using the appropriate psychotherapy techniques.

Psychotherapy workshops with children and adolescents

The number of workshops done with the children and adolescents in refugee camps Dare Bombol and Cicino Selo in 1995 was 44. The children and adolescents were devided in 4 groups, and each group had assigned a team consisting of a psychiatrist and a psychologist.

Each workshop lasted for 2 hours and there were three types of workshops: integrative workshops (for children and adolescents from 7 - 18 years, including the parents), psychodrama workshops (14 - 16 years old) and adolescent workshops (16 - 18 of age). For individual treatments, the children and adolescents were treated separately at the Center.

The members of the team were included in permanent supervision and education, and as a supplement to that they took active participation in the Peer Counselling Workshop during June 1995.

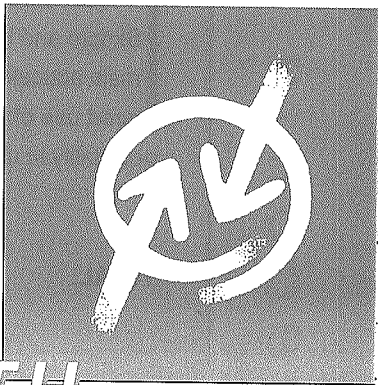

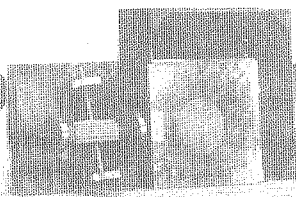

Economic Reform

The program on Economic Support had two basic activities during 1995: Green Corridor and Small Credit Fund.

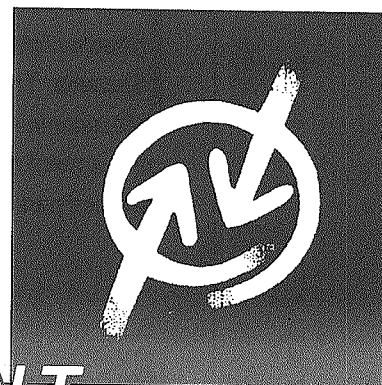
In order to alleviate the situation with the blockades to the north and the south, efforts were made to set up a **Green Corridor** - alternative transportation lines to Slovenia and Croatia, the old markets for early vegetables from Macedonia. Trains could not be used and transportation by airplane was too expensive. Normal truck transportation through Bulgaria, Romania and Hungary usually took more than 20 days, which meant that even with refrigerated trucks the vegetables could not reach Slovenia on time, before turning to mush. For this purpose, an alternative route was negotiated and set up, going through Albania, but providing a ferry price for the truck which was almost one half of what was usual till then. This "new" route made it possible to transport the vegetables within two to three days.

Furthermore, a special contact line was established for gathering information on offered quantities of vegetables and fruits, exchange of pricing information and establishing contacts between sellers from Macedonia and buyers from Slovenia and Croatia. Hundreds of calls were answered by the two interns that were hired for this job. A list of 1100 addresses of potentially interested farmers and agribusinesses was compiled and used to mail information to them.

In a joint effort with VOCA - Volunteers in Overseas Cooperative Assistance, a **Small Credit Fund** was established. VOCA is a USAID funded project that provides technical assistance to farmers in any part of their operation, based on volunteers from the US. Initially, OSI-Budapest awarded a grant of USD 100,000 each to Albania, Macedonia and Bulgaria, targeted at successful VOCA projects. In agreement with the VOCA office in Macedonia, we transformed this grant into a revolving credit line for individual farmers, where farmers that have used VOCA technical assistance have priority. The principles for the Fund were established and negotiated with everyone concerned. A bank was chosen and contracts were drafted, involving also legal assistance from the New York office. An Advisory Group was formed, to steer and decide in matters of the Fund; it consisted of one representative of the OSI-Macedonia Board, one specialist in agriculture and one in financing. Guidelines for the operation of the Fund, as well as of the Advisory Group, were established. Finally in September the contracts with the bank were signed and the first credits were approved by November.

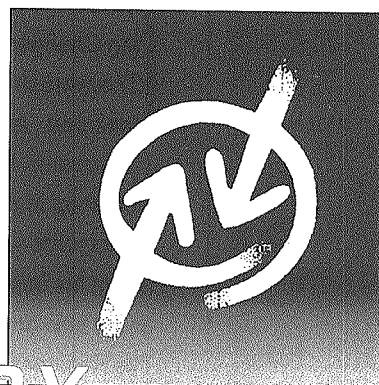

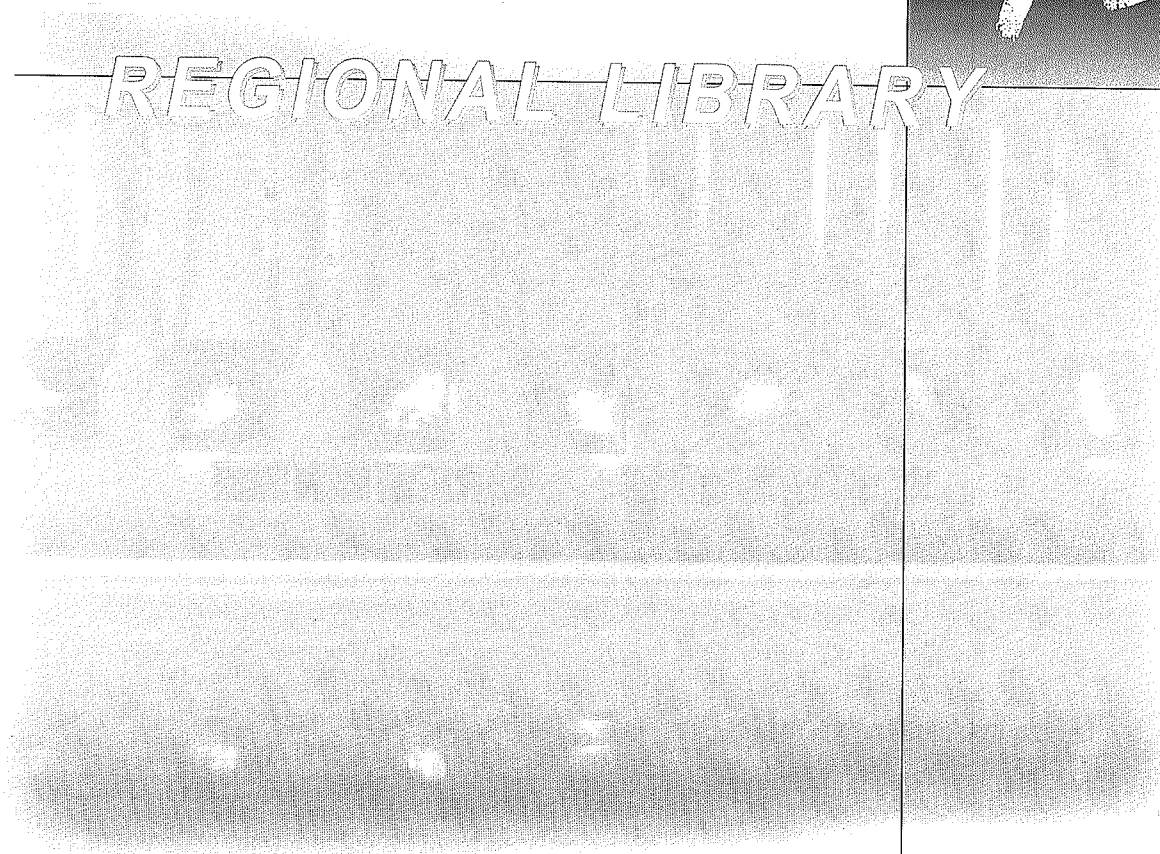

In the effort to develop a strategy in the Management Training Program, the Open Society Institute - Macedonia organized a pilot seminar guided by Nenad Filipovic from the International Executive Development Centre, Brdo pri Kranju, Slovenia. This seminar showed one more time that the managers in the field of economy, in circumstances when Macedonia was squeezed in the sandwich between the embargo in the South and the sanctions in the North, did not have a need nor an interest for management knowledge under conditions of a regulated economy. Thus, people were awarded partial financial support in order to finish their management education or professionalism abroad.

In the beginning of 1995, the Regional Library Program-Budapest and OSI-Macedonia organized a workshop "Managing Changes in Libraries" run by Sheila Ritchie from Great Britain.

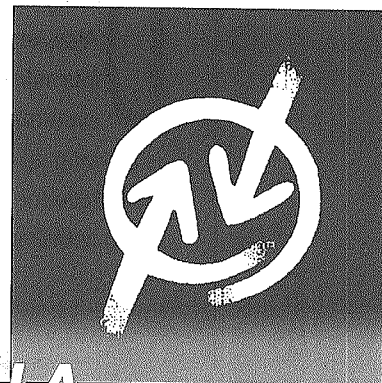
The workshop was held on January 24-27, 1995 in Ohrid, where 12 participants from libraries throughout Macedonia took part, as well as a representative from the Ministry of Culture of the Republic of Macedonia.

The modern trends in connection with the changes in library management were presented to the participants in the workshop in a method which was new to them. Namely, this was done through a polling of the participants. In this way participants were directly stimulated to give suggestions and proposals on how to build a successful relationship between the international practice of library operation and management, and the management in the Macedonian libraries under new conditions.

The Regional Library Program supported a study stay at the Mortenson Center-University of Illinois, Urbana, Champaign, USA, where Nikolce Veljanovski from the Home and University Library "St. Kliment Ohridski", Bitola improved his knowledge in library automatisation.

For the first time in 1995 representatives from the three biggest Macedonian libraries, supported by OSI-Macedonia, went to the IFLA Conference in Istanbul and they become members of the IFLA organization.

Radio

During 1995, the transmission equipment that was purchased and paid for in 1994 for radio stations, was installed. Also, equipment for other radio stations was purchased and there were grants awarded in payments for fees for journalists for the production of programs in the languages of the minorities. Broadcasting equipment (an antenna system) was bought for Radio "Kanal 77" from Stip. This medium showed a large development at all levels and it is growing up with the ambition to become a network with coverage of a big percentage of the territory of the country. OSI-Macedonia supported the establishment of new association of private radio stations. The new association will develop activities in connection with the networking of private radio stations and the pending broadcasting legislation.

Production of joint shows among private TV stations was supported at the beginning of the year. A TV trainer, Cathy Konkurght from the UK, visited Macedonian TV stations. Also, the TV production of the TV stations was supported; an example is the support for the preparation of a documentary about Albanians from Macedonia in Switzerland, produced by TV Art, Tetovo. Another TV station was supported with equipment; this was the Center for Radio and TV from Negotino. After the flood, when a lot of damage was caused in this area, TV Negotino was damaged, also. This TV station received equipment for TV studio production. The Center for Radio, TV and Print from Kumanovo was awarded with a grant in the form of video studio equipment, to a total amount of \$6,532.60. For the project for transmitter network connections among private TV stations and for other professional equipment, "Teleconsult S.A.S." was paid an amount of \$27,566.61.

Closed from the South and North and forced to respect the restrictive obligations set by IMF, the Macedonian state budget does not have great possibilities to support the publishing. The publishers, whether for books or cultural journals, can not expect wide market: the citizens are poorer and poorer.

It is paradoxical that the number of publishers is growing. First, the number of books and cultural journals in Albanian are increased. Private publishing houses publishing in Macedonian were established. The pluralism freed spiritual energy of increased curiosity for us and for the others.

The lack of capital works in the field of humanities in Macedonia whose publishing needs great capital which returns to the publishers very slowly, is felt strongly. All that effected the Publishing Program (Publishing by Title, Cultural Journals and OSI Clubs) to have a priority importance.

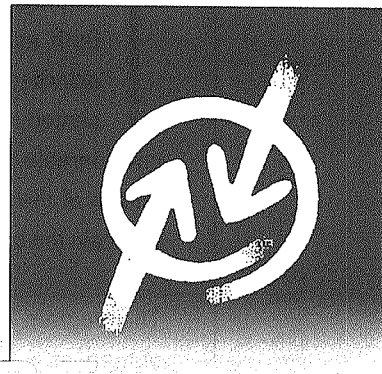

The program performed as an additional vital source to support arts and culture projects from all over Macedonia. Both, established cultural institutions and emerging independent projects suffered of lacking funds to perform their activities and they rely on the sources from the program. The Soros Center for Contemporary Arts - Skopje, Macedonia, made the decision to undertake a more radical approach to the art community in 1995. Past experiences were used as guidelines for some of the ways to explore and motivate large aspects in the field of art. Turning more towards the main generation, made up of younger artists, the SCCA Board developed a strategy to support more experimental projects dealing with issues, such as offering an opportunity for a new technology and its artistic capability to encourage a free and open relation between the artists and the media. The informative activities gained in importance and defined the office as one of the very rare places to get recent information on many worldwide events. Through the sessions, lectures and screening, the office became an open place for discussions and art subjects.

After the first year of shaping the image of the SCCA, this year the office became a very professional and attractive source for any need in the field of art. Several international projects, many grants for supporting art projects in the country, as well as providing the artists with international competition in any field, make the office one of the most active ones in the country.

The achieving of this concept anticipates new practical and theoretical explorations. The 'Icon on Silver' has to represent the connection between two value concepts, united in the CD-ROM medium. The first concept refers to the communicational characteristics of the icon, and the second to the technological basis that modulates and intermediates these characteristics. It contains the assumption that the submitted projects on this theme, in their final presentation, should be linked to the elements of the technology of the CD-ROM medium. These 'pages' from the artist's book have to reflect the current artistic approach towards this technology.

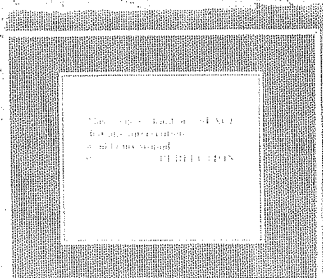

This initiative for a network of Soros Foundations allows foundations to create projects that will bring diverse experiences from the region to the region, addressing issues of development of the non-governmental sector, social welfare, culture and cultural relations.

OSI-Macedonia offered to the region the SKOMRAHI meeting of students of the Faculties of Drama Arts, the Second Balkan Summer School for Social Work and a unique round table discussion titled "Small Industry Cinema Production and Film: Cinematographies of Small Nations".

An advanced program for Training Trainers in Conflict Resolution and Prevention was designed for members of NGOs from Macedonia, Albania and Yugoslavia.

Over thirty individuals, specialists from different fields attended projects offered by other Soros Foundations from the region.
